IDEA #1

Reduce bullying

Bullying among 6-12 students is a complicated issue. At the root, there are three soft skills areas that are impacted:
Communication, Teamwork, and Stress Tolerance. Understanding the areas where your students have opportunities for growth is a powerful tool as you create interventions and programs to mitigate bullying. Student EI data delivers this student data in real time to you and your staff allowing you to develop targeted and relevant interventions.

IDEA#2

Improve attendance rates

This can be achieved in a number of ways with the data in Student EI. Regular attendance is linked to work ethic in students. To start, use the data to create a benchmark for students who have a high rate of attendance. Then, create a cohort of students who struggle with attendance. Using the benchmarks, identify areas where a student may need support or interventions to help them get to school.

IDEA#3

Move from reactive to proactive

If you're noticing problematic behaviors at your school, an intervention may be too late. A targeted, proactive approach requires data that measures skills and uncovers gaps. Student EI delivers meaningful data that identifies skills gaps allowing you to build proactive, targeted and useful interventions.

IDEA #4 Support Teacher Retention

Soft skills data provides a great deal of insight into what makes each student unique. The data provided is often sparks engaging conversations with students in the classroom. This contributes to a pool of positive classroom experiences, which improves teacher retention.
